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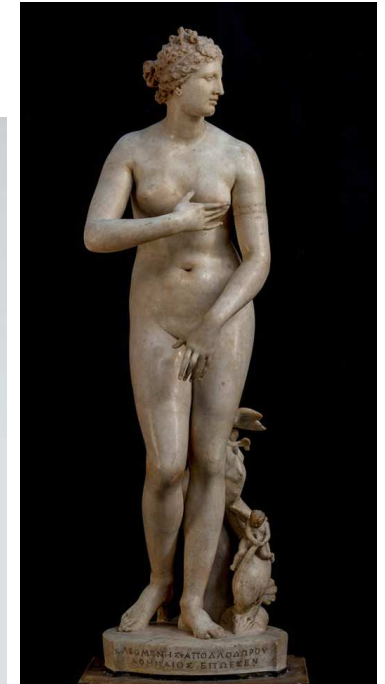

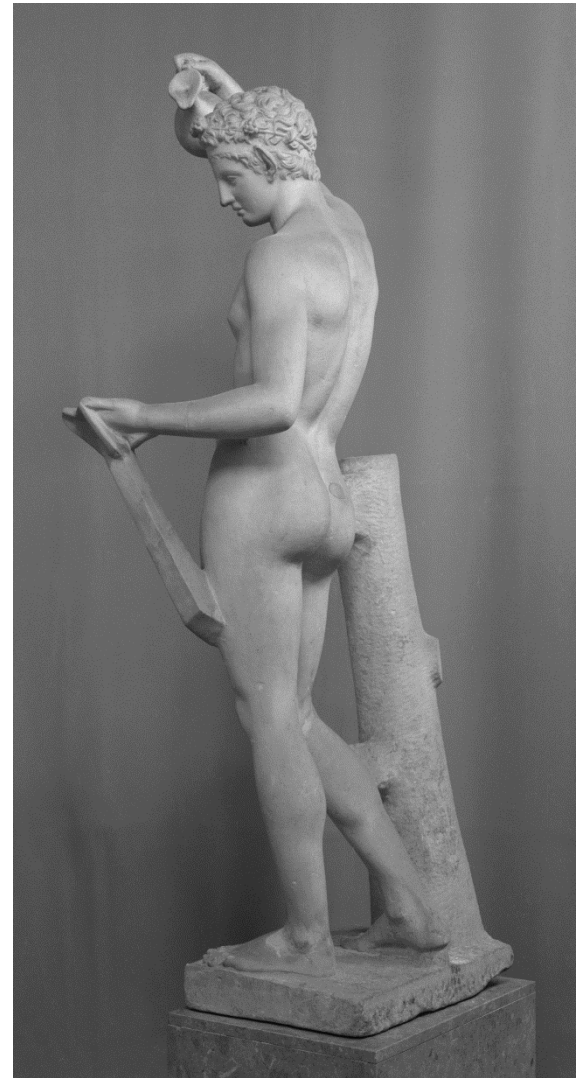
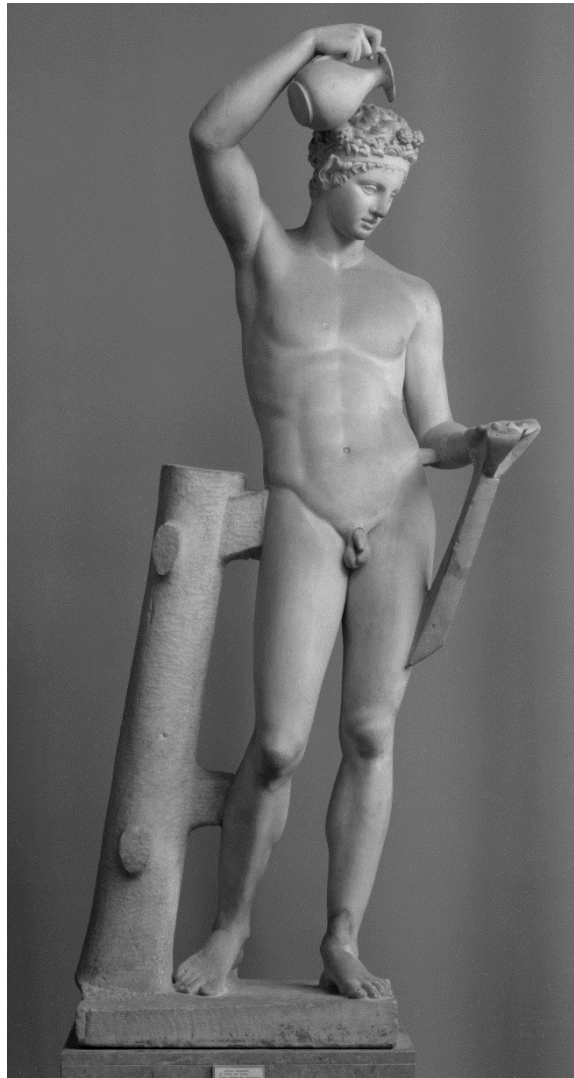

left: Dionysus with panther; right: companion of Ulysses**



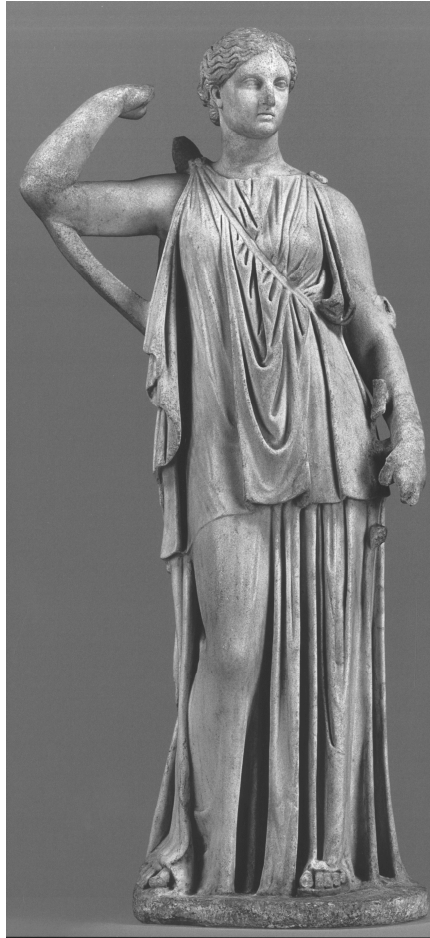

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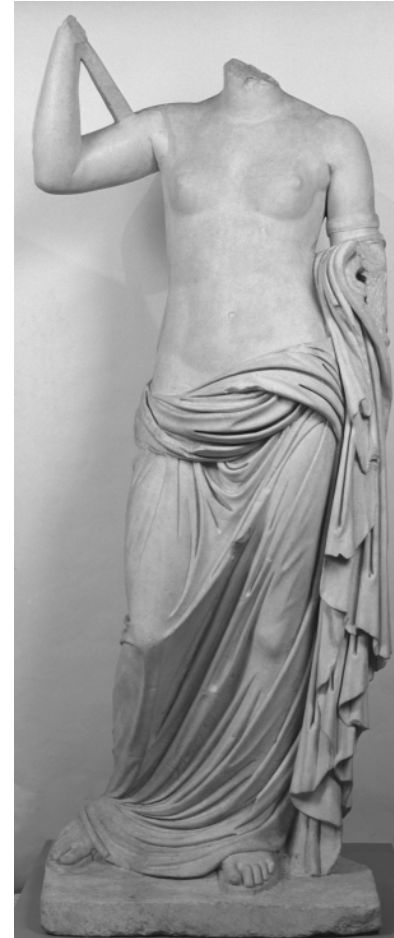

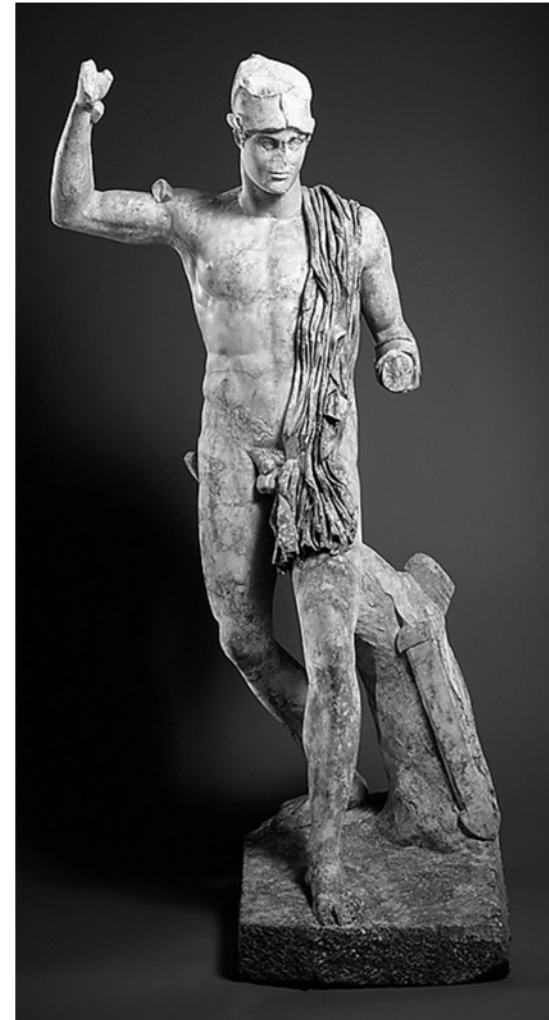

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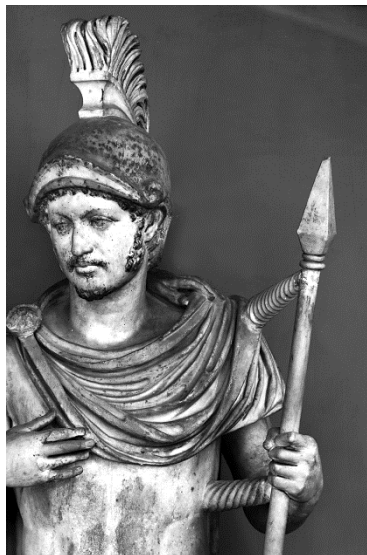

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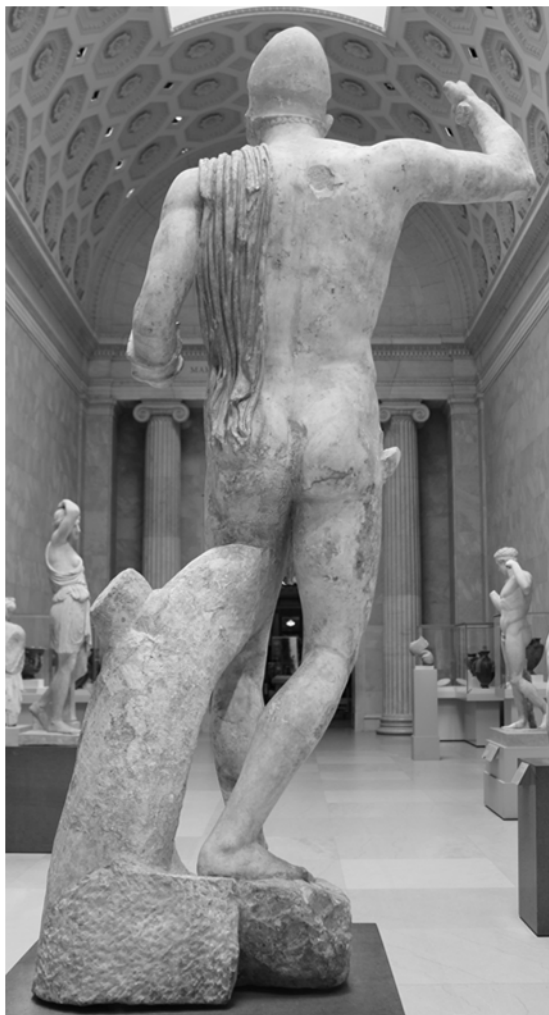

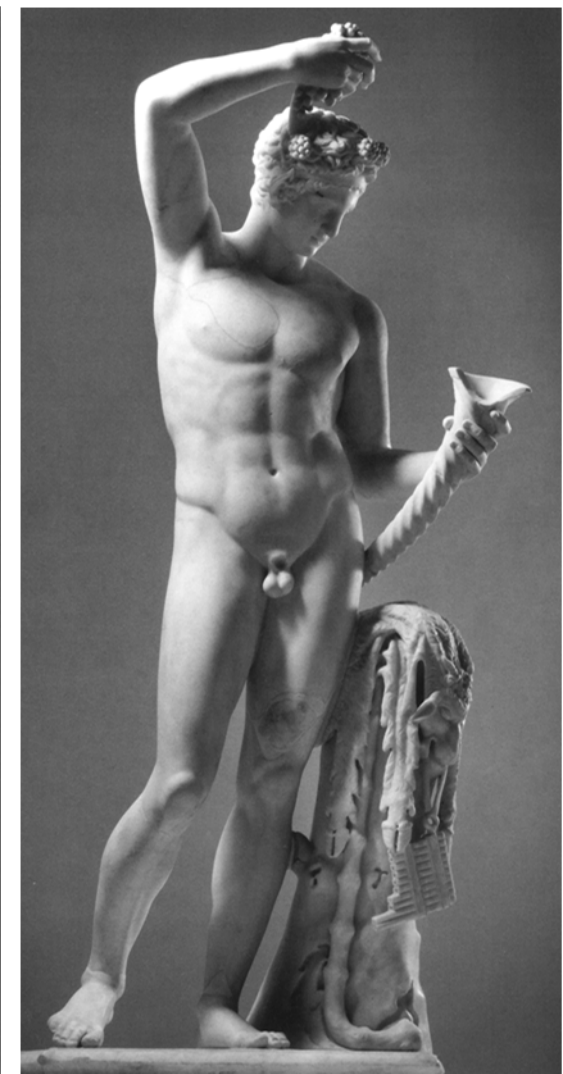

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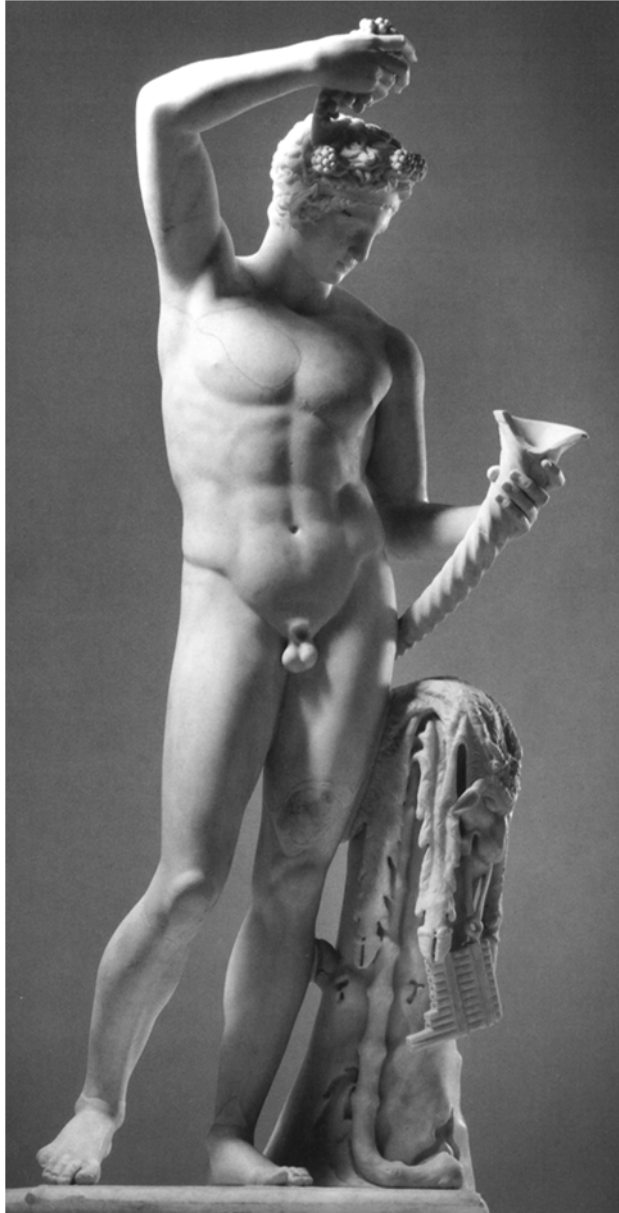
